










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Selection Process





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Potential Foot & Ankle QI Registry

• ACFAS is investigating the feasibility of a Foot & Ankle QI Registry

• Our 2021 Member Survey confirmed the importance of research to our members:

• Over 73% of respondents believed research supported by ACFAS was extremely valuable or very valuable.

• Over 55% of respondents indicated ACFAS should support the development of a clinical outcomes-based foot & ankle registry.

• 25% of respondents said they would pay to participate in a surgical outcomes-based foot & ankle registry. 45% were not sure.
