There is a heavy emphasis on arthroscopy, trauma, hindfoot and forefoot reconstruction, sports medicine, and total joints/ankle replacement.

Sports related injuries in pediatrics. Minimal to no diabetic foot care/charcot recon.

How many days per week do you typically spend in the OR? In clinic? Do you have your own "fellow" clinic?

Tuesday is our dedicated OR day. If there is a lot of trauma, we add cases on Fridays or before clinic on Mondays.

Fellow clinic on Fridays to see post-ops and my own patients.



How many surgical cases do you typically scrub per month?

Varies per month, depending on trauma. 20 to 40

What conferences have you attended/are you encouraged to attend?

ACFAS Annual Scientific Conference. Any fellows course endorsed by industry when possible.

How would you describe your director's teaching style?

Demonstrator/Mentor/coach. Gradually gives fellow more independence as year progresses.

How is research incorporated into your experience? What resources are provided/available? Yes. Dr. Hollawell, Hackensack Meridian for IRBs/statisticians.
