




Continued COVID Effects • Podiatric Medical Colleges are delivering curriculum in many forms (in-person, online, hybrid) as local restrictions and new variants allow. · Career Outreach being hampered. · National events for health advisors and others remain online. • Podiatric events remain online - two podiatric career fairs, December 2021 and one upcoming in April 2022. • One lone suturing 'Workshop in a Box' event held 9/8/21 held at UNC-Chapel Hill. 56 students participated in this annual event. • As soon as we return to in-person events, we will reach out to residency faculty and residents to participate by relating stories about their podiatric medical career.

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Clerkship • Unlike last year, to date there are no widespread cancellations of clerkship rotations due to COVID disruptions. • The 2021 Clerkship cycle, to schedule clerkship rotations for January of 2022 through May of 2023, concluded last October. • 216 programs participated and 634 students · 5,851 offers were processed in three offer and acceptance rounds • 3,228 clerkships were successfully scheduled • The schedule for the 2022 Clerkship cycle is pending approval by the AACPM board. 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NationalMatching Service \bullet Acting on a recommendation by its Council of Teaching Hospitals (COTH), the AACPM Board of Directors approved the outsource of most CASPR functions to National Matching Service (NMS). NationalMatching Service NMS was founded in 1985, after developing sophisticated matching software to place physicians into residencies in the United States. Since its founding, NMS has implemented Match Placement Systems in a number of industries and professions, including healthcare, education, law, and financial services. Some examples are: Dentistry Optometry Pharmacy · Canadian Medical Residency Match The transition is underway and is effective for the 2023 CASPR Residency Application and Match Cycle which gets underway this spring. 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AACPM 's Council of Teaching Hospitals (COTH) • COTH leadership transitioned last July. · Kerry Sweet, DPM completed 2 years as chair. · Danae Lowell, DPM, chair-elect, transitioned to chair. • Charles Lombardi, DPM was chosen as chair-elect. • COTH met in September to consider the 2022 CRIP and recommended to the AACPM Board that it be cancelled. The Board approved the recommendation. COTH further recommended to programs that residency interviews be virtual. REBOOT

AACPM 's Councilof Teaching Hospitals (COTH) • At its October 2021 meeting, and after a thorough due diligence process, COTH voted to recommend to the AACPM Board that a partnership be formed with National Matching Services (NMS) and the majority of CASPR functions be transitioned to them. · COTH is participating in the transition and implementation as members of the User Group formed to provide input to NMS and AACPM staff. • COTH agreed to a request from the college Deans to continue the PGY I Resident Competency Assessment for 2021 and 2022 graduates. • It is hoped it will contribute to assessing the impact of COVID accommodations on graduates of these classes REBOOT

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
